



VETERANS Corner

Our annual Veterans Day Luncheon was attended by 60 veterans. We were honored to have four World War II veterans and five Korean war veterans present. The Daughters of the American Revolution, Mojave Chapter, a commemorative partner for The United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration, were on hand to honor Vietnam era veterans who served on active duty from November 1, 1955 – May 15, 1975, regardless of the location of their service. Each veteran received a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin, family members of veterans who died after the war received Blue Star pins. There was also recognition for family members of living veterans.

Elks from Fullerton, Mission Viejo and Newport Harbor Lodges and members of the Placentia American Legion Auxiliary came together to clean and prepare barracks rooms for Marines and Sailors returning to Camp Pendleton from deployment. FULLERTON ELKS SPECIAL CHILD NOVEMBER 2019

Makayla Bodo was born on April 11, 2002 and is 17 years old now. Born premature at 4 pounds 13 ounces she had to fight for her life from the very start. Her multiple defects diagnosed as the CHARGE syndrome included both of her nasal passages blocked by bone. She had to have a breathing tube surgically placed in her neck until she was 7 years old. She had heart and abdominal defects, developmental delays and she is hard of hearing. Makayla uses an I-Pad to communicate and sign language. At age 5 she was diagnosed with a form of cancer called histiocytosis, which is an over production of white cells leading to organ damage and tumor formation. She beat this cancer without having to have chemotherapy. She had numerous surgeries on her head and throat due to having cranial Chraniosynostosis. The fontanelles, the soft sports on an infants skull, closed prematurely which caused her skull to become malformed. At age 7 she had a full cranial reconstruction. She has had multiple surgeries for her nose so she could breathe from it, and multiple eye and ear surgeries. Makayla goes to special needs classes at high school and enjoys being on the Sparkle cheerleading team for special needs teenagers. She loves gymnastics and horseback riding at the Shea center for therapeutic riding. She loves to bake. Makayla is a fun girl, is happy and enjoys life. She truly is a miracle child. Makayla Bodo was presented with a gift card to horse back therapy and there were gifts for her family, Dad John, Mom Tera, and brother JJ.
