


Binding us through Elkdom.

Passion creates passion for volunteer projects

Over the past few months we've asked volunteers to share stories and advice about serving veterans in their community. We recently contacted Minnesota State Veterans Chair Thomas Kramin to ask how he and his state volunteers get so much done. His simple answer was "Passion creates passion."

"To get started, approach the Members with a project that you have a heartfelt passion for," Kramin said. "Make sure you have a fluid plan on how to accomplish the project. When you ask for help, you open the door for outside opinions on how to do it. Be open. You cannot do it alone. Find quality people to help with the project, lay out the fluid plan to them, and delegate tasks to them without micromanaging. Present a task that needs to be accomplished and let them do the rest."

As State Veterans Chair, Kramin helps oversee 20 volunteers at 13 voluntary service facilities and helps with dozens of local and state projects. Partnerships and working with the community are key to his success, so be sure to ask for assistance. Once these volunteers are involved, it's important to be flexible and understanding.


"Remember that everyone is a volunteer, working on a volunteer income," Kramin said. "Life gets in the way sometimes and you must remember the volunteers have families and bills to take care of first. Gentle nudges for reminders work better than dropping the hammer on them for being late in the reporting."

When pressed as to why he spends so much of his time volunteering, Kramin said "Helping veterans is more addictive than any drug available on the market. The sense of life accomplishment and self-worth you feel in your soul afterwards is so overpowering that you want to do more."



CERTIFICATE SALUTES NEIGHBORS WHO FLY THE US FLAG

Lodges can present a Grand Lodge Recognition Certificate of Honor for properly flying the United States Flag during daylight hours and at night with proper illumination. It can be awarded to local businesses, merchants, and non-Elks households but not hospitals, schools, or government buildings.

The Recognition Certificate is available at <u>elks.org/GrandLodge/fraternal/files/FlyTheFlagCertificate.pdf</u>. Or, it can be found on the Fraternal Committee page in the Members Only section of <u>elks.org</u>, under Fly the Flag Program & Certificate (PDF).

The certificate is a fillable PDF, so you can type in the recipient's name and address. Also, there's a place for the mayor or other city official to sign.

To print the certificate correctly, "Landscape" should be chosen for the orientation in your print window. Parchment paper is the best option for a professional-looking product. Certificates can be presented during special recognition events at the Lodge, if possible.

Hoop Shoot finalist emulates dad

Wayne Bower developed plenty of grit en route to the 2019 Hoop Shoot National Finals. But, he might've learned a bit about grit, and now gratitude, from his dad, too.

"The Elks Hoop Shoot was like a religion in our family," said Jacob Bower, Wayne's dad.

Jacob is the youngest of five boys, all of whom competed in the Hoop Shoot. Jacob's father, who died when Jacob was 3 years old, encouraged his older sons to participate. They continued their father's legacy. Jacob competed every year from the time he was 8 and won the National Championship in 1997.

Jacob loved his Hoop Shoot experience, and so did Wayne. As Wayne advanced, he traveled to Portland, Oregon, and Chicago—places he'd never been.

"It reminded me about all the good experiences I had with the Hoop Shoot," Jacob said. "As I researched my Lodge and saw how much they give to the community by helping others, especially kids and veterans, something inside me told me I needed to join."

Jacob submitted his application to join Nampa, Idaho Lodge No. 1389 before the 2019 National Finals.

"It's just something I believe in," Jacob said. "Getting involved in it has been so exciting. I just love everything about the Elks."

Three winners are named in each of the six membership divisions. First place Lodges are awarded a plaque, while second and third place Lodges receive a certificate. Plaques and certificates will be presented at the Grand Lodge Convention in Baltimore.

Addicts tell their stories to teens in new DAP video

The ELKS Drug Awareness Program (DAP), the nation's largest all-volunteer drug education group, has partnered with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) to launch a national anti-drug educational video "Teens React To Conversations with Survivors of Addiction" to spotlight the effects of drugs on teenagers. The video premiered in late November on FBE, a multi-platform digital studio that serves over 34 million subscribers, with additional content running on its Twitter and Facebook pages using hashtag #ElksDAP and #DEA. As of mid-December the video had over 500,000 views.

The video features teens and their parents watching interviews from a diverse group of adults who describe their journey into addiction and road to recovery. After viewing the footage, the teens and their parents meet the interview subjects in person and further explore their experiences.

Ahead of the nationwide campaign, teens from all over the country participated in the Elks Anti-Drug Video Contest. The 2019 winning entry, Sunshine by El Modena High School Sr. Sandy Beach, elicited very strong and emotional reactions, and was then watched by the teens, parents, and individuals in recovery as seen in the video. Following this, the group then engaged in a candid and heartfelt discussion that is a must watch for parents and their children. It is at times lighthearted and other times heart wrenching as the parents, teens, and people in recovery connect on a truly human level.

The video, while being very engaging, also provides information for teens and parents on how to handle peer pressure, conversations with your kids, signs that someone you care about might have a problem, and many other important subjects critical to keeping kids safe and drug free. The video also encourages parents, kids, and teens to visit www.elkskidzone.com, the Elks DAP Kids site, www.getsmartaboutdrugs.com, and www.justthinktwice.com, the DEA's website for teens and parents, educators, and caregivers, all of which provide access to an array of education and treatment resources.

"FBE is dedicated to sharing stories that make an impact," said Marc Hustvedt, CEO of FBE. "Our wide array of content often ignites emotional responses and this effort really provided a human spotlight on a very serious issue. We look forward to sparking an important conversation with our community and draw attention to the powerful resources like ELKS and the DEA who are there to help. You are not alone."

The Project was once again created by Sunny Day Entertainment, who previously partnered with the DEA and Elks DAP on several anti-drug videos with SMOSH in 2017 and 2018. The Elks have also created several comic books, including ones with the New York Fire Department and Marvel which are available on www.Elkskidzone.com.

Kent Gade, National Director of The Elks DAP, said "The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks is committed to finding unique and effective tools to provide education about illegal drug use and legalized drug abuse by our children and adults.
