



ELKS RAISE FUNDS TO HELP DISABLED YOUNGSTERS

More than \$3.5 million has been contributed this year by members of Elks Lodges throughout California and Hawaii to be used in treating children with disabilities. Diana Mondragon, Exalted Ruler of Fullerton Elks, Lodge #1993, of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (BPOE), representing the Elks Lodge at a recent Convention, contributed \$28,691 which was raised by the members of the Fullerton Lodge. The Orange District, which is comprised of eight Lodges in Orange County, donated a total of \$215,276. "I am pleased and proud that members of this local Lodge were so generous with their dollars and time in this important undertaking," Ms. Mondragon said.

Since 1950, the 84,000 members from California and Hawaii have turned over more than \$120,500,000 to the California-Hawaii Elks Major Project, Inc., which administers the non-profit charitable corporation in the BPOE.

All of the funds are devoted solely to providing vision screening and therapy treatment to children with a broad range of disabilities. Without the Elks supported donations, many of these children would not receive such treatment. The year-long fundraising campaign is capped by a ceremony at the annual California-Hawaii Elks Convention, recently held in Fresno, when representatives from Lodges throughout California and Hawaii presented their donations to Major Project and Elks Association leaders.

The raising of funds to aid children with disabilities is just one of the many philanthropic and patriotic projects which mark the Elks' contribution to our communities. 

An example of that is providing a positive, memorable evening for a group of youth such as an Honors Night, including a banquet for those who have recently graduated from high school and awarding scholarships to those in need of financial assistance.

Hosting an event for the veterans in our communities, sponsoring programs for the boy and girl scouts in your community, providing monetary support for people in the community who are less fortunate — These are examples of the utilization of the grant money available to enable a Lodge to perform these types of charitable events.

After hosting an event or program, the second step is to create a report of these activities. List the number of people involved, the total mileage, time, and money spent, and the value of scholarships presented.

The third step is to submit the finished report to your Lodge Secretary. He or she will complete the reporting in CLMS to Grand Lodge to make them aware of the charitable work we are performing at the local level. It is their responsibility to pass this information to the United States government to make them aware of our charitable performance within our Lodges. Also, the reports will provide positive information to hopefully improve our 501(c) (8) tax status by increasing the dollar amount not required to be reported as income by a nonprofit, charitable organization.

The mission of the Grand Lodge Government Relations Committee is to guide our Members, our State Associations and our Lodges, and to protect and preserve the right to exist as a private, nonprofit charitable organization.

As we go about all these activities within our Lodges, please take the time to thank everyone involved on a committee or an event that may be an ongoing project, an annual project, or event that has just been completed. The recognition will provide a great deal of satisfaction to that individual, making them feel appreciated as a Member of a great organization.


