ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) is now accepting applications for the 2020 the “Most Valuable Student” and the Legacy Awards Scholarships. Applications for both scholarships will be applied for online. This year, applicants will be given their choice of five nearby lodges in our Orange Coast District to pick their affiliation. Our Lodge Judges will be able to see the objective scoring previously not revealed to judges. Objective scoring includes points for academics, community services, honors and awards, financial need, extracurricular activities and employment. 24 hours after submitting our Lodge scores, we will be notified who will be advancing to the next level of judging.

“Most Valuable Student” Scholarships

The “Most Valuable Student” Scholarship is open to any high school senior in our District who is a US citizen. They do not have to be related to an Elks member. Applications will be judged on scholarship, leadership, community involvement, and financial need. Selection begins at the local level and progresses through district, state and national competition. 500 scholarships will be awarded in late April 2018 with many them \$4000 awards (\$1000 per year). Interested students may apply at enf.elks.org/mvs. The Online application deadline is November 5, 2019. Our scholarship judges will have between December 5th and the 20th to evaluate submissions.

“Legacy Awards” Scholarships

The “Legacy Awards” are awarded to college bound high school seniors who are children or grandchildren of Elks members. 300 scholarships of \$4000 will be awarded in 2020. This is a statewide competition. Applications will be judged on the values of knowledge, charity, community service and integrity. The Online application deadline is January 31, 2020. The judging committee will be appointed by the Elks National Foundation Board of Trustees. Interested students may apply at enf.elks.org/leg.

FOR VETERAN HELP, STAY INFORMED TO STAY RELEVANT

Who do you think of when you think of a veteran? A senior citizen in a "Vietnam Veteran" hat? A woman with young children? A young man in need of housing? There are an estimated 22 million veterans in the United States and they all have different needs. As Elks, we need to stay informed of those needs to ensure our programs stay relevant.

The post-9/11 veteran population is expected to increase 22% between 2016 and 2021. Today's military is 14% female, and that's expected to increase to 20% in the next 10-20 years. About 55% of veterans are aged 65 or younger. More than half of veterans don't use any VA services. Many traditional veterans organizations are losing members. That means we have to work smarter to connect with veterans.

Here are some tips on how to do that. Start by thinking locally. For example, it's estimated that one-fifth of homeless veterans live in California, making the Welcome Home program especially effective in that state. Alaska has the highest percentage of veterans aged 20-34 at 17 percent, so active, outdoor activities could be more popular. And in many rural areas, the biggest issue facing veterans may be transportation and access to medical care.

Once you've identified a need in your community, find partners. Build relationships with veterans, facility staff, and volunteers directly in your community. You may be familiar with the adage, "if you've been to one VA, you've been to one VA." That's true of many veterans programs. You will likely need to adapt project ideas and processes to work best in your community.

Finally, when in doubt, listen. Every generation, every community and every person has different challenges.
