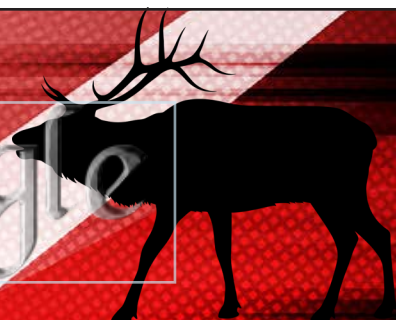

We are going into an eventful time of year and there are numerous opportunities for volunteering. Think about helping out for an event or just participating by buying a ticket.

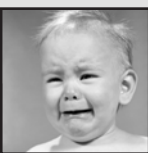

ENF grant applications are now in progress as follows: Beacon Grant for food insecurity in conjunction with the County of Orange Animal Control; and Spotlight Grant for food insecurity in conjunction with Pathways of Hope for local food distribution to Fullerton community individuals and family in need.

While the Impact Intent letter for our Impact Grant application is under review for consideration, we are proud to report our lodge members raised \$351 at the July 22nd lodge meeting to purchase 50 backpacks and school supplies to help support our Maple School community education support campaign (see photo above). 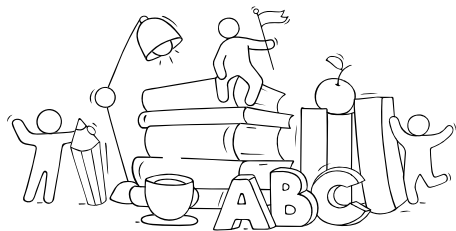
Make an Impact
