

In 1868, through the efforts of these benevolent individuals "The Jolly Corks" was renamed The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of The United States of America (BPOE), or simply "Elks". The "Jolly Corks" still exist in our organization. It is a group of hard-working individuals that get nominated by the Jolly Corks in the lodge. I had the honor of joining this elite group in 2012. Leading Knight Purple Pig Challenge Raises \$11,004


