I was proud to represent our lodge at the 157th Grand Lodge Convention, over the 4th of July week in Atlanta, Georgia, with 6,038 in attendance. It was enlightening to learn much more about the programs, charitable works and impact of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, which now has 1,876 lodges.

The Business Session provided reports of the Resolutions Committee, Registration, Board of Grand Trustees and the Grand Forum. There were reports on the Disaster Relief Fund, Government Relations, Auditing & Accounting, Activities Committee, and Fraternal Committee. Congrats to Orange Lodge #1475 for winning 1st place "All American Lodge". The final Ritual Contest brought honors to the Orange Coast District with the Garden Grove Lodge #1952 team winning 2nd Place by only 0.1 point. Their Loyal Knight, Richard Axe won All American Loyal Knight.

During the Legislative Session, delegates passed eleven resolutions to amend statutes of the Order. This included the establishment of the Elks National Drug Awareness Commission to better promote these programs. A summary of the voting results is provided within this newsletter.

The convention closed with a moving Memorial Service, Membership & Marketing presentation, Installation of 2022-2023 Grand Lodge Officers & District Deputies. Congratulations to our new Grand Exalted Ruler Bruce Hidley from New York and to our new District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler (DDGER) Oscar Garza from Orange Elks. Our GER's theme is "Promoting Elksdom with Enthusiasm." We will strive to work together to enhance Fullerton's programs & community impact with enthusiasm.

During the month of August, please join us to welcome our CHEA President, Brad Smith and his wife Agnes on Saturday August 6th and our visitation with DDGER, Oscar Garza on Thursday August 11th. It is a great time to meet both Brad and Oscar and show the pride we have in our lodge. On Saturday August 13th, we will enjoy a trip to an Angels game. Join us to support our local homeless vets at a Veterans Stand Down on August 17th. Then, have a wonderful time at both Summer Sizzle steak night on Saturday August 20th and the return of the Parcel Post Auction on Saturday, August 27th. The Parcel Post Auction is a fun evening with many appetizers from around the world and bidding on fun items brought back from members travels at home and abroad.

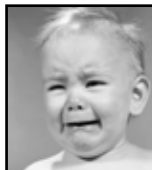

What is a Knight?

In today's standards, a Knight is a person granted an honorary title of Knighthood. In days of old, a Knight's job was to protect, defend and serve the land and its people. Now they call us Police Officers. The Knights and Police Officers have the same tributes: Ethics, integrity, accountability and honesty. All highly regarded and important values for both to possess. At all

times, police officers must follow the law and departmental regulations. For example, use of force must be reasonable and necessary. They are expected to carry out their duties and responsibilities equitably and justly. Police must not show favoritism or act in a discriminatory manner recognizing that all citizens deserve respectful treatment regardless of race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, national origin or religion.

The police code of ethics prohibits dishonesty and corruption. Police officers who engage in serious misconduct on duty or in their personal life can face disciplinary action and legal prosecution. When assisting crime victims, police have a duty to be caring, compassionate and responsive by taking the report seriously, pursuing the offender and explaining victim services available in the community.

The knight did the same job when he got appointed by the king to serve and protect the land and his citizens.

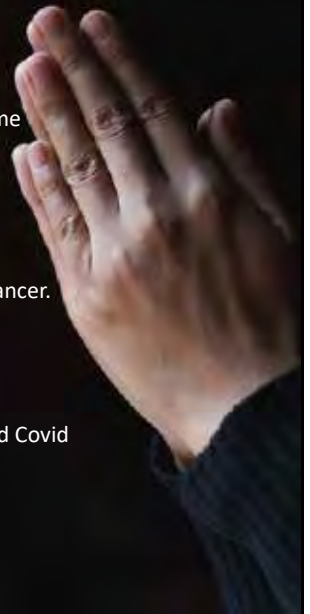
