Many Americans celebrate Labor Day with parades, picnics and parties – festivities very similar to those outlined by the first proposal for a holiday, which suggested that the day should be observed with – a street parade to exhibit “the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations” of the community, followed by a festival for the recreation and amusement of the workers and their families. This became the pattern for the celebrations of Labor Day.

Speeches by prominent men and women were introduced later, as more emphasis was placed upon the economic and civic significance of the holiday. Still later, by a resolution of the American Federation of Labor convention of 1909, the Sunday preceding Labor Day was adopted as Labor Sunday and dedicated to the spiritual and educational aspects of the labor movement.

American labor has raised the nation’s standard of living and contributed to the greatest production the world has ever known and the labor movement has brought us closer to the realization of our traditional ideals of economic and political democracy. It is appropriate, therefore, that the nation pays tribute on Labor Day to the creator of so much of the nation’s strength, freedom, and leadership – the American worker.

## ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) is now accepting applications for the 2023 the "Most Valuable Student" and the Legacy Awards Scholarships. Applications for both scholarships will be applied for online. This year applicants will be given their choice of five nearby lodges in our Orange Coast District to pick their affiliation. Our Lodge Judges will be able to see the objective scoring previously not revealed to judges. Objective scoring includes points for academics, community services, honors and awards, financial need, extra-curricular activities and employment. 24 hours after submitting our Lodge scores, we will be notified who will be advancing to the next level of judging.

### "Most Valuable Student"

**Scholarship.** The "Most Valuable Student" Scholarship is open to any high school senior in our District who is a US citizen. They do not have to be related to an Elks member. Applications will be judged on scholarship, leadership, community involvement, and financial need. Selection begins at the local level and progresses through district, state and national competition. 500 scholarships will be awarded in late April 2023 with many of

them being \$4000 awards (\$1000 per year). Interested students may apply at [enf.elks.org/mvs](http://enf.elks.org/mvs). The Online application deadline is November 14, 2022. Our scholarship judges will have between December 2nd and the 19th to evaluate submissions.

### "Legacy Awards" Scholarships

The "Legacy Awards" are awarded to college bound high school seniors who are children or grandchildren of Elks members. 300 scholarships of \$4000 will be awarded in 2023. This is a state-wide competition. Applications will be judged on the values of knowledge, charity, community service and integrity. The Online application deadline is February 6, 2023. The judging committee will be appointed by the Elks National Foundation Board of Trustees. Interested students may apply at [enf.elks.org/leg](http://enf.elks.org/leg).

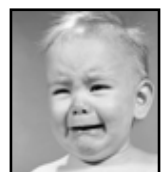

## BINGO TEAM

**Team Members:** Approximately 97 members currently volunteer on five color coded work teams which each have 18-20 members per team and report for duty every fifth week.

This month's Volunteer Spotlight shines on the Fullerton Elks Special BINGO Team. Since reinitiated in April 2021 and following COVID required hiatus, BINGO exists to generate funds for the Elk charities. It also enhances our community relations since it is open to the public which has resulted in several BINGO players become members of our Lodge or other lodges.
