Its social activities and benefit performances increased the popularity of the new Order. May we all work together to ring in the 155th birthday of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks next month by focusing on this wonderful balance of social activities and serving those in need.





The judging committee will be appointed by the Elks National Foundation Board of Trustees. Interested students may apply online at enf.elks.org/leg.






