There are more than 800,000 law enforcement officers in the United States. It's a tough job and getting tougher by the day. Over the course of my 27 year career, I tried my best to represent my badge and my city as best I could. It is unfortunate but true, but it only takes one high profile incident to shed a dark cloud over the entire profession. I experienced this many times over my career, starting with Rodney King and ending with George Floyd. That's

because people don't see individuals, instead, they see a uniform, and when one tarnishes the badge it tarnishes all of them.

Likewise, there are just over 800,000 Elks in the United States, belonging to over 1900 individual lodges. A small percentage of those members are officers in the lodge. For example, in our lodge with over 900 members, only 19 are lodge officers. But every single member is an Ambassador of Fullerton Elks Lodge. 
