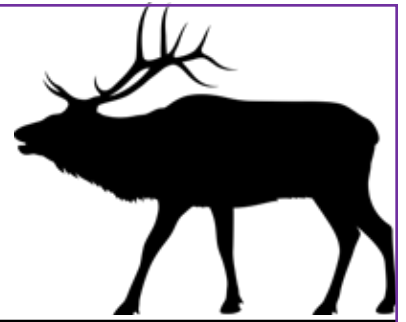

## From Our Leading Knight



As this Elk year closes, I want to thank all of you, our members, for supporting our lodge this past year!! It was a great year, stacked with activities and opportunities to give to our Charities.

For those of you who do not know, I am a naturalized American. I immigrated from Ireland when I was just a wee lad. I look forward to celebrating St. Patrick's Day! The day was first established in 1631 as a modest religious holiday honoring Ireland's patron saint. When my parents lived in Ireland, they spent the day in church. The

day evolved into parties and parades because it fell right in the middle of Lent. People began using it as a reason to celebrate and take a break from the restraints and abstinence of the period leading up to Easter. It didn't become a public holiday in Ireland until 1904.

Who is this Saint we celebrate every March 17th? Saint Patrick lived in the fifth century and was born in Roman Britain—not Ireland. He was 16 when he was captured by Irish raiders and sent as a slave to present-day Northern Ireland, where he became a shepherd. He grew close to his Christian faith during these difficult years and then went on and spread Christianity to the Irish through baptism and confirmation. Hundreds of years after his death, several legends became popularized about this religious figure. One of these includes the famous story of St. Patrick driving the snakes from Ireland.

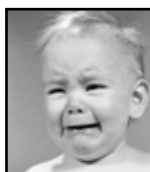

## ENF Gratitude Grant Helps Lot 318 Non-Profit

Fullerton Elks Lodge No 1993 partnered with a Placentia based non-profit, Lot 318, to support and enhance educational efforts for underprivileged children at their established community locations. Lot 318 has a long history of working in these impacted communities and helping in a variety of ways: after school education, leadership training, parenting training, and helping with food insecurity.

To help create additional incentives to achieve homework completion goals for these disadvantaged children, Fullerton Elks Lodge obtained a \$2,000 Grati-

tude grant. 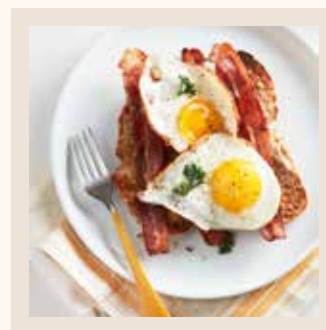

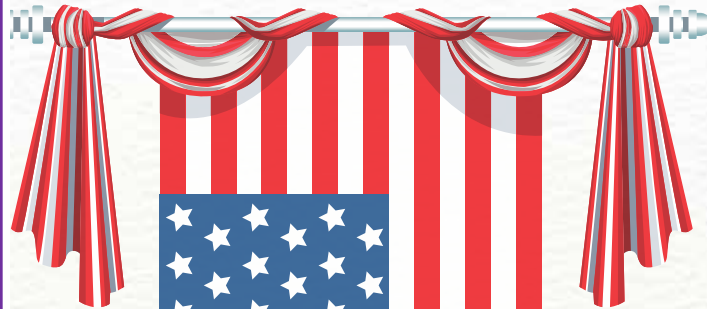
