It's written in our initiation ritual that, charity is the cornerstone of every Elk structure. This is not only true, but it was the very reason for the founding of the Elks. Although Charles Vivian is credited with founding the Elks, it was George McDonald that first purposed the idea of going from a drinking club, "the Jolly Corks", to a benevolent association, after a member of the Jolly Corks unexpectedly died and left a widow and her children destitute. It

was also Mr. McDonald who first proposed a formal toast "to our absent brothers" on May 31st, 1868.

What is written about George McDonald tells us that he was a kind and considerate man who was charitable to those in need and concerned about the well-being of our members. That spirit is alive and well today. When a regular member doesn't show up, when we would normally see them, people start asking where they are, phone calls are made, sometimes worry ensues, and then relief when we learn the member is fine, they just decided to go to grocery store instead of the lodge. The fact that those founding principles, established by men like McDonald, are still alive after 155 years, is a real testament to the character of our members and why it is such a privilege to serve you as an officer of this lodge.


