Dear Brothers and Sisters,

He was the recipient of our special child award in 2010 and became a member of Fullerton Elks Lodge in 2019.

Nate has his own way of communicating with those around him and his desire to be involved as a lodge officer did not go unnoticed. Exalted Ruler Brian Mc Namara, appointed Nate Fonseca as Assistant Secretary of Fullerton Lodge #1993 and he was installed for the 2023-2024 year. He is always one of the first officers to enter the lodge room on meeting nights, taking his place at his station. When not in his lodge suit or tux for meeting nights, you can find him wearing his lodge shirt with name badge, and according to his grandmother, he wears it pretty much everywhere he goes.

Our Grand Exalted Ruler Bruce Hidley's motto for the year is, "Promoting Elkdom with Enthusiasm." I can think of no other officer who does that better than Nate. His infectious smile, enthusiasm and pride in being an Elk, lifts the morale of our lodge and sets a great example for our membership and he does it all; without saying a word. I know many of us wish that Nate wasn't burdened by his disabilities and was more like us, but perhaps we could be better Elks, if we were more like Nate.

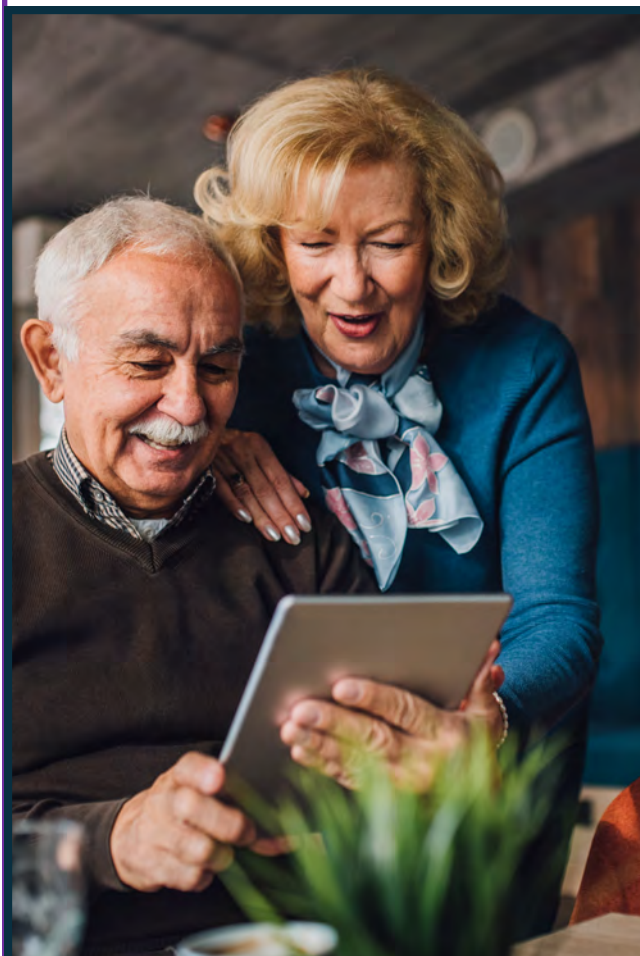
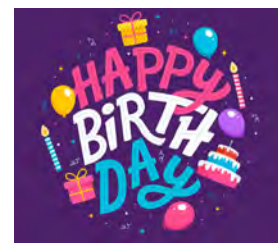

Membership Vote Grand Lodge Resolutions

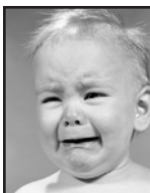

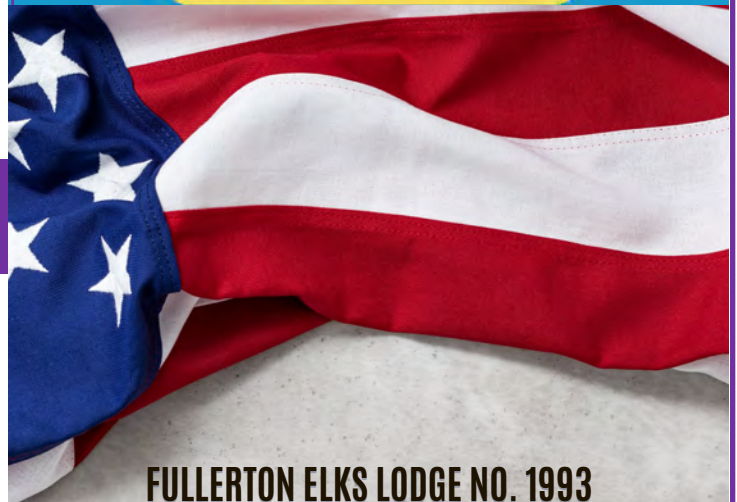

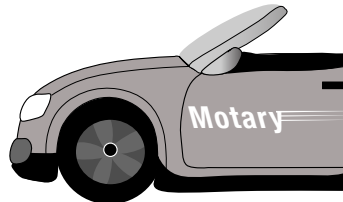
