

Learning ways to see and approach certain people

As soon as I enter a room, I scan it and everyone inside. I am a noticer and pretty intuitive, so I pick up on things quite easily. How someone is standing can tell you quite a lot about them. If someone is standing hunched with their arms crossed, you can probably make a well-educated guess based on their expression whether or not they are introverted or just pissed off. However,

if someone is standing with their feet slightly apart, with their hands out and down (more by their hip area) I see them as more open and carefree.

The easiest one. Frowning? Pissed. Smiling? Yup.
Those are the most identifiable ones. But no one is that black-and-white.

Here are the more advanced expressions to recognize, which incorporate body language. I can tell fairly easily whether or not someone's smile and laugh are real or fake. Using their body language and expression together, it's pretty simple. Look at how they are standing and see if it matches their expression. If they're standing in any of the ways I said indicated annoyance or sadness or introvertedness, yet they are smiling and laughing, that is a tip that they're faking it. Another thing I use is their eyes. People express most of their true emotions in their eyes. It's hard to hide things that way, and people like me who are good at reading people know this is the oldest trick in the book.


