It is a universal ethic, with the power to cut across gender, culture, age, beliefs, and social-economic status.

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) is now accepting applications online for the 2024 "Most Valuable Student" & "Legacy Awards" Scholarships. This year applicants will be given their choice of 5 nearby Elks lodges in Orange County. Our Lodge Judges will be able to see the objective scoring (academics, community services, honors and awards, financial need, extracurricular activities and employment). These were previously not revealed to judges. 24 hours after submitting Lodge scores, we'll be notified who will advance to the next level.

"Most Valuable Student" Scholarship

The "Most Valuable Student" Scholarship is open to any high school senior in our District who is a US citizen. They do not have to be related to an Elk. Applications will be judged on scholarship, leadership, community involvement, and financial need. Selection begins at the local level and progresses through district, state and national competition. 500 scholarships will be awarded in late April 2024 many as \$4000 awards (\$1000 per year). Go to enf.elks.org/mvs to apply. The Online application deadline is November 13, 2023. Our scholarship judges will have between December 1st and the 18th to evaluate submissions.

"Legacy Awards" Scholarships

These are awarded to college bound high school seniors who are children or grandchildren of Elks. 300 scholarships of \$4000 will be awarded in 2024. This is a statewide competition. Applications will be judged on the values of knowledge, charity, community service and integrity. The Online application deadline is February 5, 2024 at enf.elks.org/leg. The judging committee will be appointed by the Elks National Foundation Board of Trustees.
