Merry Christmas and I hope this month finds you well and ready for what is one of the busiest and most charitable months of the year. My wife Leslie and I just returned from the California-Hawaii Elks Association Mid-Term Conference in Riverside and had a great time getting to meet Elks from across the state and Hawaii. One of the highlights of the conference was the ENF



(Elks National Foundation) dinner. The district Vice Presidents from the nineteen districts in the state of CA and HI, reported their mid-year donations to ENF. Some districts raised \$10,000, some raised \$25,000. One district reported a whopping \$79,000 which drew a great deal of applause from the crowd. Last to report was our very own Orange Coast District VP Bryan

Baker, who reported that we had raised \$180,000 for ENF. Remarkably, only three other states in the entire country have raised more money than our district.

You should be proud that you belong to one of the leading districts in Elksdom. We set the bar in charity, in recruitment, and exemplify the highest standards in the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. This is known not only in CA but across the country.

Every dollar you donate to ENF comes back as \$2 in grants to our State. This is made possible because less than 8% of your donation goes to overhead and the rest is invested. Today ENF has almost 800 million dollars invested and the interest made on that money is what pays for those grants. This year alone, ENF will give out over 50 million dollars in grants. You can be a big part of that by becoming an ENF Fidelity Club member. For the cost of a cup of coffee, you can make an automatic donation every month. To sign up, go to Elks.org. Click on the Support ENF and Monthly Giving icons. Let's keep Orange Coast District the leader in charity and set the standard for Elks across the nation.
