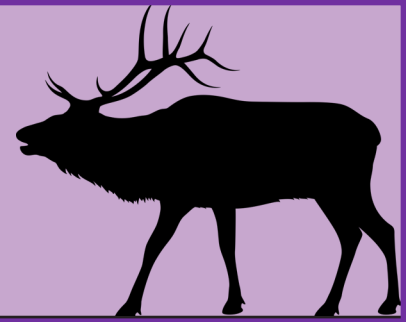

Hopefully, you were able to attend our December 7th Lodge of Sorrow meeting, where we remembered all eleven members we lost this year.
