



## By-Law and House Rules Changes

**The following BY-LAWS & House Rules Proposed Changes/Updates will be voted on the floor of the lodge at the regular lodge meeting, June 20th at 7:30PM. By-Laws**

**ARTICLE X: FEES AND DUES, Section 1 (Currently Reads)**  
Section 1. The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant who has passed his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, all of which should accompany the proposition. The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant making application prior to his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$10.00, to accompany the proposition.  
**Proposed Change:** The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant shall be \$50, all of which should accompany the proposition.

**ARTICLE XV-A: AUXILIARIES AND ADJUNCT ORGANIZATIONS, Section 1. (To be Added)**  
The Lodge hereby recognizes Fullerton Emblem Club and Ladies of the Elks as the official Ladies Auxiliary (Auxiliaries) of the Lodge provided its (their) aims and purposes remain consistent with those of the Lodge and the

Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks.

**House Rules**  
**# 13 (To be added to the current rule)**

The same guests are only allowed to enter three (3) times per year unless an application is on file. *(The purpose of this rule is to encourage membership. Following the Elks policy of 3 times a guest 4th time a member.)*

**# 29 Update**

**29.** The following dress code is to be observed in the Lounge on Friday's Club after 6:00 P.M. Absolutely no tank tops or halters will be allowed. Shirts and shoes must be worn. Shorts (no short-shorts or cut offs) may be worn after 6:00 P.M., so long as they are of an acceptable "Dressy" type. Hats of an acceptable style and character are permitted in the Club during operating hours.

**New # 33 (New Rule)**

**33.** All Lodge bartenders, whether paid or volunteer, are required to have completed Responsible Beverage Service training and any other training that may be required by the state board of Alcoholic Beverage Control. "The Lodge prohibits the over service of alcohol."
