In all there were 6,444 in attendance. By the end of the week we had passed 18 Resolutions, Elected Douglas A. The most impressive report was from Government Relations Committee Chairman William Bryan who reported that the total national giving by the Order in time, money, and in-kind donations over the past year was \$502,486,385. We also heard from the Veterans, special needs children, our youth and their families who had directly benefited from those donations.

As the closing ceremonies came to an end, we left knowing that we have much to be proud of and yet, there is still much to do. Membership will be the key to our continued success. Fortunately, the gains in membership we have seen the past few years have not been seen since the 1970's. Even with tough economic times, our members continue to set new records in charitable giving. I was proud to represent our lodge, and all of you should be proud of the great accomplishments made by our Order.






