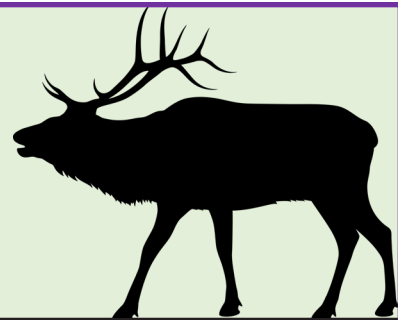

Last month my wife and I attended the Grand Lodge Convention in Austin Texas. We extended our stay which gave us time to visit family, eat way too much BBQ and visit my favorite little roadside café in Spring Branch, where they have the best fajitas on the

But back in Austin it was Convention time and an impressive opening ceremony. You may have heard that everything is bigger in Texas, but one look at the Convention floor and you saw nothing is bigger in Elksdom, than the California Hawaii Elks Association. With 50 states and 3 territories represented, California had the largest section of reserved seats. We also led the country in the most members added to the Order and continue to lead in our charitable donations. We had the opportunity to speak to Elks from across the country, exchanging ideas, sharing stories and hosting many of them at our hospitality suite.

In all there were 6,444 in attendance. By the end of the week we had passed 18 Resolutions, Elected Douglas A. Schiefer as Grand Exalted Ruler, learned that we added over 14,000 new members to our order and heard all the committee reports. The most impressive report was from Government Relations Committee Chairman William Bryan who reported that the total national giving by the Order in time, money, and in-kind donations over the past year was \$502,486,385. We also heard from the Veterans, special needs children, our youth and their families who had directly benefited from those donations.

As the closing ceremonies came to an end, we left knowing that we have much to be proud of and yet, there is still much to do. Membership will be the key to our continued success. Fortunately, the gains in membership we have seen the past few years have not been seen since the 1970's. Even with tough economic times, our members continue to set new records in charitable giving. I was proud to represent our lodge, and all of you should be proud of the great accomplishments made by our Order.

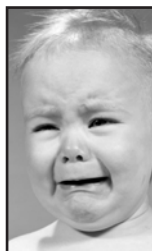

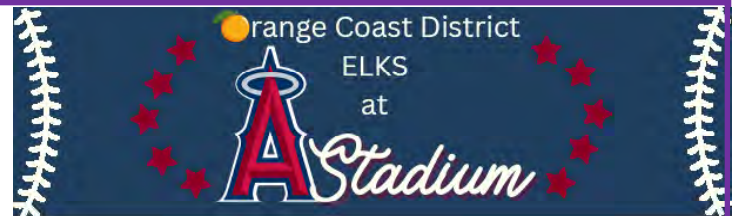

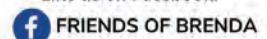
