#### **Our Amazing Flag**

The United States flag, like most of the flags we find around the world, has a special significance because its design is closely linked to the values and ideology that the country itself seeks to reflect.

This flag is also known as the "Stars and Stripes," "Old Glory," and "the Star-Spangled Banner," and it represents not only the country's government but also the ideology on which American society is founded.

No one knows for sure the true origin of the American flag, but it is speculated that its primary designer was Francis Hopkinson, who, along with seamstress Betsy Ross, created the first American flag.

The design was decided at a conference held in June 1777, when it was established that the flag had to contain: 13 alternating red and white stripes, 13 white stars on a blue background. The number 13 comes from the fact that, at that time, there were 13 colonies in the United States that wanted to become independent from Great Britain, and therefore, they created this symbol that defined them as a homeland distinct from England.

On June 14, 1777, this design was approved, and since then, this day has been known as "Flag Day."

## **Biography for** California-Hawaii Elks Association President Scott Stephens

Scott Stephens was born in Detroit, Michigan. After finishing school, at 22 years old, he picked up and moved to California. He served on the District Veterans Committee for 2 years, was the District Americanism Chairman, was Photographer for 2 District Deputies and CHEA Pres., Art Echternacht. Scott served as Esquire to the District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler in 2015-16. During that time, he was also one of the top ENF fundraising District Chairs in the country for 3 years, and #1 in CHEA for 2 of the 3. The Orange Coast District raised \$364,667 during those



3 years. He and his wife have also raised over \$37,000 for CHEMPI and ENF by hosting 9 cruises over the last 16 years.
