- Cancer patients use nearly one quarter of the blood supply more than patients fighting any other disease.
- A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 pints of blood.
- A diverse blood supply is important! A patient is more likely to find a compatible blood match from a donor of the same race or a similar ethnic group.
