

From the Station of Brotherly Love...

I have a patch on my notebook that savs: "Not All Disabilities Are Visible." Many of us live our lives with challenges that go unnoticed even by our friends. That is why we all need to live by the rule we learned in kindergarten, "Keep your hands to yourself". There are ways to show brotherly love without touching someone. A big smile or a "How ya doing" shows your care and affection

for a person, without touching him or her.

We need to respect people's boundaries. Some people are uncomfortable with someone entering their personal space. Sometimes there's a definite reason for this. For example, a military veteran may be suffering from PTSD and coming up behind that person and grabbing his or her shoulders may make that individual feel very uncomfortable, and it may trigger his or her PTSD. Many of our members here at the Elks Lodge are veterans. We need to be conscious of this and respect their space.

Another thing to consider is that some people may be experiencing chronic pain due to an ailment, such as arthritis, fibromyalgia, multiple sclerosis, and other debilitating health issues. For this person, a hug or a pat on the back can literally be painful. Personally, I live with fibromyalgia, and I live with chronic pain. My pain is concentrated in my upper back and shoulders. We have a term in the Fibro community called "Gentle Hugs." I like hugs, but sometimes they can hurt.

We have no way of knowing if a person is okay with being touched or not. If they have a debilitating condition, whether it be emotional or physical, we cannot see it. Their pain is not tattooed on their foreheads, so how would you know if they have it? You wouldn't, so please keep this in mind next time you want to grab or hug someone.

Dan Casey shared that Tom Conlan had oral surgery, keep him in prayer.



Mychal Redman was born one month early on July 13, 1990. He will be 35 years old this year. He reached all his milestones late and started speaking short sentences at 3 years of age. It was determined that he had moderate Autism and developmental and cognitive delays. He was given services to meet his learning needs and a special education aide in the classroom to guide him

During middle school, Mychal met Courtni Laughlin, who was part of a program that takes special needs students under their wings during breaks and lunch to help them socialize and meet other students. Courtni went on the create the No Limits Learning Center in Brea where Mychal and our own Nate Fonseca are enrolled in school. The students at this school run the Snack Shack where students can purchase snacks and breakfast during morning breaks. They also provide coffee for sale on Friday mornings to all who drive up at the school between 8:00 & 8:30 a.m. The students fill all the jobs for the snack shack, including running the cash register and stocking the shelves. Mychal's Dad is involved with the Rotary Club of Placentia, and he stays busy helping with their charity efforts by stocking up food boxes and filling new backpacks for children in low-income families.




