

FULLERTON ELKS

The Fullerton Elks hosted Nicodemus Collinsworth as June's Special Child. Nico lives in Portland, Oregon. We were able to Facetime him and his family from the Hospital for the Special Child Presentation on the floor of the Lodge during our Meeting. He was born September 27, 2022 in Portland, Oregon. He was one month premature with Downs Syndrome and soon he was diagnosed with a congenital heart defect. He had holes in two heart chambers and had open heart surgery when he was 7 months old, which corrected this defect.

A year ago, Nico was diagnosed with B-cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia. He was in the hospital for a month undergoing extensive tests, chemotherapy, and steroids, which caused very uncomfortable side effects. He is back in the hospital and still on chemotherapy for the next six months. Nico does not understand what is going on, but he remains sweet and innocent, and he is staying strong and doing well in physical therapy. He is now crawling, and he is strengthening his leg muscles and learning to stand.

Nico now has a younger brother, Gideon, who is 8 months old. They have developed a very close bond. Nico loves his match box cars and books and often pretends to read to everyone. Nico lives in Portland with his parents, Andrue and Hannah Collingsworth. He was referred to us by his aunt, Nikki Muller, a local nurse who has volunteered with our Special Child Program for a couple of years.

Gifts were presented to Nico's aunt, Nikki Muller; Nico's Great Grandmother Barbara Hayden, and a family friend, Robin Keese.
